15th March 2017

Please be advised for your next AGM we no longer supply Parish Councils with Police Reports and all figures are available on the monthly newsletters.

CRIME UPDATE

In the last year there have been **28** reported crimes in Witnesham:

Burglary Other Building x 14

Burglary Dwelling x 2

Theft from Motor Vehicle x 2

Theft other x 3

Assault x 2

Harassment x 2

Other crime x 3 (this could include Fraud/Damage etc)

Please note the above figures do not include any Domestic related reports but for obvious reasons you will not be given any details for those crimes.

Please also note some the Burglaries were due to insecurities which clearly makes it easier for Burglars. Lock up your sheds and outbuildings !

Parking and Speeding

We have carried out speed monitoring in variety of locations all over the Woodbridge patch (47 villages) using both speed camera and speed indicating device. Worked with and supported Community Speed Watch schemes in operation on the district.

We have carried out, as often as possible, patrols of hotspots for parking offences giving advice or issuing fixed penalty notices. The Special Constabulary have also contributed and patrolled areas, issuing tickets as necessary

We have continued to work with partners to address concerns of ASB use of vehicles around Martlesham and Woodbridge using patrols and ASB legislation.

Staffing

Please note at this time we only have 1 Police Officer and 3 PCSO's working out of Woodbridge SNT.

The Mobile Police Station will not be in Witnesham in March as we will be elsewhere on our patch.



Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone.

You can take steps to safeguard yourself and your property, you may need to change plans, or re-route, because of an incident nearby or you may even be able to help us solve a crime.

If you are a member of a 'watch' scheme, Police Connect information keeps you up-to-date with the latest issues. It's also a great way of finding out about local policing events and meetings.

By receiving messages through Police Connect, you are kept in the loop.
